Hi Everyone,


Hope you are able to get out and enjoy the sunshine even if it is quite cold at the minute. We are slowly walking towards spring, lighter mornings and some much needed Vitamin D.

I am sure you have seen in the press this week that there is pending strike action with some of the teaching unions, which is currently planned to take place on the 1st of February. As is stands, our teaching staff have taken the decision not to strike and school shall remain operationally normal for all of the children. I must add that whilst we are not striking, we are operating our school with the tightest of budgets I have ever seen in my entire career. The staff pay award the government granted to staff for this academic year was unfunded by the government and we have had no choice but to pay this from the main school budget. It has essentially emptied the school bank account and we have a very small amount of money remaining for any unforeseen circumstances (boiler, staff sickness, and urgent equipment repairs) which may arise until we are given our new budget at the end of March. School funding is my biggest concern as I begin the planning process for the next academic year and whilst we have so far been able to continue to fund the current staffing model if there are no changes to our school funding. So please do email, tweet, Insta message and ask questions of your local MP's as we have to be heard as the funding we need is for our children's futures.

Polite Plea I have had sent to me from our local community:

I do think Brenda's message is very fair and in the best interests of all our children's safety. I understand in the cold and miserable winter weather, parents are eager to drop/collect their children quickly but we do have to make sure all of the children are able to enter and exit our school safely whilst respecting our neighbours and local community.

I must also request that if you drop at the main gate with me/Mrs Petrie/Mrs Dobson, unless your child has an individual arrangement for arriving at the big main gate due to additional needs, then all families are expected to line up with everyone else. I am responsible for ensuring the youngest 180 children in our school are handed over to their families safely. It can feel overwhelming when there are many families crowding in the staff car park and I struggle to be able to see which child has gone to which adult. The system is in place to keep everyone safe and I do ask that it is respected. I do my absolute best to dismiss the children as

Could we ask that cars stop parking on the double yellow lines on the bend into our entrance. If you have a blue badge, you are welcome to use our designated (blue badge) spaces by the unit/ surgery for dropping off and picking up your children.

If you come on foot, please use the pathway around the car park and not walk through the middle of it.

The car park is for visitors to Thompson Court and the surgery so please dont park there.

Finally please dont use the car park to turn around.
