

# Top Tips to Practise Spellings and Times Tables

## Times Tables Online


There are lots of great times table games online as well as free apps that you could try.

Practise answering times tables **out of sequence** to make sure you really know them.

e.g.  $6 \times 3$ ,  $3 \times 3$ ,  $9 \times 3$

Answer a **missing number question** like  $6 \times ? = 24$




## Sorting Numbers

Try writing down some numbers and sorting them to practise recognising numbers in each times table (multiples).

Where would you put 14?

Explain why.

Where would you put 21?



## Right or Wrong?

Write down times table questions for somebody else to answer but include some errors for them to spot too.

Who can spot all of the mistakes in the fastest time?

## Games to Play

**Times Table Bingo** - write down 6 numbers in a particular times table (e.g. 12, 60, 6, 30, 72 and 18 for the 6 times table). When a question is asked ( $3 \times 6$ ), cross off the answer if you have it. Cross off all 6 and shout Bingo!

**4 in a row** - draw a grid with 12 boxes and write down 12 numbers in a particular times table. When a question is asked, cross off the answer. Play against a partner and be the first to cross off 4 in a row.

Look, Say, Cover:



Write, Check

Look at your spelling, say the word, cover it up, have a go at writing it, then check. If your word is spelt correctly, well done! If you have made a mistake, work out where you have gone wrong, and have another go.

Repeat this for all of your spellings.

## Sentences

As well as learning how to spell the words, it is very important to understand the meaning of these words too.

Practise writing each word in a sentence.

Can you include your word in a sentence that is about one of these things?



Remember to check for capital letters and full stops!

Write over and over again!

The more you write your spellings out, the more your brain will remember the pattern of the letters.

Make your spellings into a word search. Write your words into a grid then hide them amongst other letters.
