We are looking forward to welcoming you all into our first open afternoon of the year tomorrow-**Friday 6th of October from 1.45-2.45pm for years 1 to 6**. Reception and nursery open afternoons will follow after the October half term. Myself and Mrs Petrie will be on hand to help families find their way around our building and Mrs Markey will be set up in the Atrium with lots of reading advice and top tips for supporting your child's reading at home.

You may have seen that the ground works are underway now for our learning village, in order to ensure everyone's safety as this building work begins, we are no longer going to be able to use the path off the canal to cut through school. Therefore please now use the top gate at the side of Key Stage 2 playground. This will also now become nursery gate for drop offs and pick ups.

We are hoping to have our learning village completed by Christmas, which is exciting and then we can move our Years 4, 5, 6 and our resourced provision base into their medium term homes for the next eighteen months. The new classrooms look amazing from the plans and are going to be huge! I think the children are going to be very happy when they see their new classrooms. These are all in one big building together with internal corridors, toilets and an ICT suite. It really is going to be a mini school for our older children.
